assist by matching everything the parents can contribute but with so many out of work or sick, I know how difficult it is for them.

For the refugees we do the best we can. Their existence is precarious, nothing is certain for them, whether they will get a visa, how long they

will be in Jordan. It is hard to be insecure in your own country, it is doubly so in a strange country as a refugee.'

The Sacred Heart's next contribution to Madaba will be delivered to Fr Butrus by Parishes for Peace, shortly before Christmas. Mike Wood.

ACT IN SUPPORT OF CATHOLIC EDUCATION

admissions cap which prevents new Catholic schools from allowing all Catholic pupils to attend.

The Prime Minister has acknowledged that this policy discriminates against Catholics and

had promised previously to abandon it. Now the Government may decide to keep this discriminatory policy in place instead of removing it. We need you to tell the Government not to discriminate against Catholics and to remove

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The figure of John the Baptist in the New Testament is a vitally important one. It has often been said that he is the last of the Old Testament prophets, and reading today's Gospel one can see how true that is. In a sense he focusses to a point all that the prophets stood for with respect to the coming Messiah; above all, John stands at the gate of the Kingdom of God and points out that in order to enter it there must be genuine repentance and good works. He sees with shocking clarity the hypocrisy of the age, and particularly that of the religious experts and controversialists; rather than respecting their authority, he calls them a 'brood of vipers', or 'children of the snake', (a bitter insult, recalling the snake in the garden of Eden, and the snakes worshipped by the devotees of Baal) rather than of children of Abraham. God could raise children of Abraham from the stones if he wished; it is not enough simply to claim physical descent from Abraham, or belonging to the Jewish race, without repentance and good works. John proclaims the coming Messiah as one who will clear out all the rubbish (by which he means the hypocrites) and test what is good with the Holy Spirit and fire.

Earlier ages of the Christian faith had a much greater devotion to St John the Baptist than is common these days (as witness the number of mediæval churches dedicated to him up and down the land). Perhaps the time has come for us to once more hear his message of repentance and good works if we are to find our place in the Kingdom of God. For we must never forget the words of our Lord 'Truly, I say to you, among those born of women there has risen no one greater than John the Baptist; yet he who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.' (Matthew 11:11)
