Gospel Reflection

If the idea of Christ being baptized does not strike you as odd, then it ought to. Even granted that the baptism of St John the Baptist was not the sacramental baptism that Christians undergo today, but only an external sign of repentance for sin, the fact that our Lord received it is distinctly peculiar. What sins did our Lord need to repent? We know that he was like us in all things but sin, and therefore we might reasonably expect that he would undergo anything except Baptism. But here we have him, not disassociating himself in any way with all those crowds who had come to acknowledge their repentance before God.

This question has occupied many minds wiser than ours. St Matthew in today's Gospel alludes to it—the only one of the four evangelists to do so, by the way; the others simply record the baptism—and has the Baptizer truly asserting that it would be more appropriate if our Lord baptized him. The authors of many apocryphal gospels also address the issue, often at length.

If we are to look for an answer to this puzzle, it must lie in our Lord's insistence that the reception of Baptism is absolutely essential for the Christian life. We cannot be a proper Christian without it, in other words for, although faith may justify us without the rite of baptism in certain circumstances (baptism of desire or baptism of blood, for instance), we cannot live the Christian life without the sanctifying grace that flows from the sacraments, and from baptism above all into the source of this grace, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ himself, members of whose mystical body we become.

Secondly, we are reminded by St Paul that 'For our sake [God] made [Jesus] to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.' 2Cor 5:21 In other words, our Lord took upon himself all that was human, even, or most particularly, our sinfulness, though he, of course, had no sin himself. Thus, our leader and founder in faith goes before us in all things, into the baptismal font, through a virtuous life to death and a glorious resurrection. Where Christ our Saviour goes, we hope to follow, and not just parts of his journey, but it all, from baptism to eternal life.

Baptism, then, stresses our entire dependence on the mercy of God, and we know that an active acknowledgement of this is a prerequisite for salvation. Let us pray that God renew the grace of our baptism in each one of us today, that we, too, may be led after our death to a glorious resurrection.

John Fisher School Vacancy - Clerk to the Governing Body Required as soon as possible

The John Fisher School is a Roman Catholic voluntary aided boys school at Peaks Hill, Purley, Surrey. The School is looking for an experienced (ideally in the secondary phase), well informed and independent clerk to support the Governing Body. The person appointed will be required to manage and organise at least four full Governing Body meetings a year and four different committees, which meet at least once per term. The Finance & Premises Committee will meet at least four times a year. The total number of hours likely to be devoted to these meetings is approximately 34 hours, with a further 6 hours per meeting for agenda preparation after liaising with HT and Chairs, write up and editing of minutes, dissemination of papers including minutes as well as advice and guidance to the Governing Body, giving a total of 136 hours on meetings related work per year. The meetings typically start between 5 & 6pm during term time however some will be held during the school day.

In addition, the clerk will be expected to provide full clerking support throughout the year amounting to at least a further 20 hours, which will include the maintenance of records, completion of returns, monitoring the policy review cycle and facilitating the election of Governors when required, providing advice and guidance to the Governing Body and liaising with the school through Janet Rigby, PA to the Headteacher, on a weekly basis by telephone or email in first instance.

Rate of pay: equivalent to the Merton ME Grade 7 scale which including holiday pay amounts to £16.16 per hour.

Application forms (support staff) are available by downloading via the website on <u>www.johnfisherschool.org</u> where further information on the school may also be found including job description and person specification. Completed application forms should be sent with a covering letter to Mrs Rigby, on <u>irigby3@suttonmail.org</u> by the closing date Wednesday, 20th January 2016. Interviews will be held week commencing 25th January 2016.

The School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and to equality of opportunity. An enhanced DBS will be required.
