Gospel Reflection

Who is my neighbour? This question is one which still needs to be asked these days. Ladislas Boros gave a succinct answer: my neighbour is a person whom nobody will help if I don't.

I like that answer; it seems to me to encapsulate our Lord's teaching in today's Gospel in one pithy sentence. It puts the onus back on to me and insists that I do good wherever I see the need. There is no space for 'charity begins at home' or for fobbing the responsibility off onto governments, charities, institutions; my neighbour's good is my responsibility.

In the past, neighbours were not so easy to find, but these days, with the possibility of modern means of information and communication, it is possible to say that neighbours run into billions. We can be aware of the starving in India or Africa with a flick of a television remote control. And it takes only a little more trouble to help them.

I suspect, however, what our Lord is getting at is more an attitude of mind. I think it was St John Chrysostom who commented that the unnecessary things we possess are stolen from the poor. This should make us think. We are entitled to retain private property, but we must remember that others may have a prior claim on it. All things are God's gift, and it is up to us to make sure that they are distributed fairly. It is true that we cannot solve all the world's crises ourselves, but not even to make a gesture in that direction is, I contend, gravely sinful. And it is better, in the clichéd phrase, to light one small candle than to sit cursing the darkness. More to the point, a Christian is bound to do good wherever he or she finds it possible.
