#### **Gospel Reflection**

In today's Gospel, St John the Baptist poses what seems to us to be a simple question. He asks our Lord whether or not he is the Messiah (the word 'Christ' is simply the Hebrew word 'Messiah' in Greek). In response, our Lord seems to pose a riddle. 'Seems' is the important word, because John would have understood perfectly well what our Lord meant, though others who may have intercepted the message (John's jailers, Herod Antipas and others), would probably not.

The reference in our Lord's riddle is to that passage from Isaiah that we heard in the first reading; 'Then shall the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf unstopped, then shall the lame leap like a hart and the tongues of the dumb shall sing'. This is a reference, not directly to the Messiah as such, but to the Kingdom of God which the Messiah shall usher in. In other words, our Lord is saying to John that the Kingdom of God has begun, from which John would infer that indeed the Messiah had come.

The good things that the Kingdom brings (healing &c) are not its only gift; indeed, they are not the point of the kingdom at all, but rather the fruits of what really matters: union with God. It was not so much the loss of the garden of Eden, or the difficulties of life, that were the disaster brought about by the fall, but rather the loss of God's presence and the increasing distance of one human being from another. Where the right relationship is restored, then the good things come about as natural and right fruits of them. Our Lord's healings in the Gospels, though sometimes spectacular, are not as frequent as one might reasonably expect them to be. This is because the real material of the Kingdom of God is our conversion; our loving God and our neighbour, and turning from evil to do good. The healing and life is something that belongs to the Kingdom of God in its fullness, and our Lord was performing these miracles as a sign of the Kingdom that was to come, and to give weight to his words.


#### Do you or does someone you know have a talent for managing people and a desire to help young people in your community?




You are warmly invited to two events at St Augustine's Abbey, Chilworth. GU4 8QR.
