Gospel Reflection

The story of the Good Samaritan has passed into our imaginations as one of the most powerful stories in the Bible. And also it encourages us reflect on the whole theme of Mercy, as Pope Francis encourages us to do.

Mercy can be defined as not exercising the punishment or revenge to which one is entitled for some offence, or extracting the compensation that might be owed in justice. We see two examples in today's central parable; the Father who was perfectly entitled to treat his prodigal son like a hired servant upon his humiliating return, and the brother who refused to extend the same mercy.

I suspect that in fact it is these two characters that our Lord is intending us principally to learn from, rather than from the rogue at the centre of the story. His story is simple; don't ever think you can't ask forgiveness of God. But we are more powerfully being asked about how we treat those who have done us wrong: are we able to set aside our perfectly just retribution? And if we choose to exact the just penalty, what does that do to us?

There is no doubt that the brother is not an attractive character. What he alleges against his prodigal brother and their father is perfectly true, and maybe he has a right to complain. But if we spend our lives extracting our due with never a moment of generosity, tolerance or kindness, then it is going to shrivel us as people far more than the original offence will damage the offender.

Sometimes an offence can be so severe as to make us incapable of forgiveness—or at least of feeling forgiving. Many people have experienced this. But we can usually be merciful and not exact revenge. In that way, I think, we can be said to have forgiven; all that is left is the bruised feelings of the hurt that has been done us.

Some call this parable 'The Forgiving Father', noticing that he, not the naughty boy, is really the central character. It might, perhaps, be better to call the parable 'The Merciful Father', because that is, really, what it is about.
