Psalter Week 2

NEXT WEEK'S READINGS Third Sunday of Lent Exodus 17:3-7 Romans 5:1-2,5-8 John 4:5-42

It would be good to remind ourselves of the context of today's reading. In St Matthew's Gospel it comes after the passage usually known as St Peter's Confession; that acknowledgement, made in faith, that Jesus is 'the Christ, the Son of the living God', and our Lord's confirmation that St Peter is 'the rock on which [he] will build [his] Church'.

In today's Gospel passage, we should note that only Peter, James and John went up the mountain with Jesus; this is strange, given that they all had been present at St Peter's Confession. The most probable explanation lies in the context; only those who believed that Jesus is 'the Christ, the Son of the living God' were permitted to see him in his glory. Having their faith confirmed in this wonderful way, and seeing Moses and Elijah (representing the Law and the Prophets) also confirming Jesus as the heir to all their teachings, they were thus strengthened for his coming passion. St Matthew, after this passage, tells of the healing of an epileptic but then goes straight on to mention that Jesus turned his face towards Jerusa-lem, where he would suffer and die. We might then see these events in an important sequence: St Peter makes a great act of faith, based on what he has heard and seen, proclaiming the truth before his brother apostles; our Lord recognizes this 'Papal' charism and establishes the leadership of the Church which would perpetuate his earthly presence in the person of St Peter. He then shows his glory to those who were to lead his church after him, and turns his face to Jerusalem to establish the New Covenant in his suffering and death, which the Church was to administer in his name.

Perhaps what we should particularly take out of this is the necessity of faith if we are to see the Lord ourselves. Faith is not, of course, a feeling (any of us can feel faithless from time to time, just as any parent or spouse can feel unloving from time to time) but a real, active commitment to what we know is the truth. If we are faith-ful, the Lord will not just show his glory, but actually share it with us. (Romans 8: 17&30) This is a promise to make cheerful the gravest difficulties that this life has in store for us.
