GOSPEL REFLECTION

The London Oratory School's motto is Respice Finem, which one might translate 'have an eye to the end'. You might otherwise render it 'remember what this is all about'. It's a good motto, and it would do us all no harm to have it in our own minds, too.

Remembering what things are all about is what helps us to keep things in proportion. We have a saying about not being able to see the wood for the trees, and it is true that when we are so obsessed with the details, we miss the important bigger picture.

The wise and foolish virgins in today's Gospel lost sight of what they were there for; simply to welcome the bridegroom on his return. Our Lord is clearly referring to some social custom associated with a wedding in his day, and clearly there is disgrace involved in the virgins' behaviour; in failing to honour the arrival of the groom they have offered insult and must take the consequences.

When our Lord uses the words you do not know either the day or the hour, he is referring to his second coming. That is easy to put out of our minds, for on a scale of probability, given that it has not happened yet, the odds are good that it will not happen in our lifetime. However the odds are very good indeed that we are going to die, and in that instance, we really do not know either the day or the hour. The funeral liturgy ends with a prayer for the mourners; 'help us to prepare for our last hour by living a good life, that we not be surprised by a sudden and unprovided death, but be ever ready'. That makes sense; that, literally, has an eye to the end, that makes us remember what it is all about.

I once heard a prayer that asked the Lord to help us live each day as though it was our last. I'm not sure, really, how practical that is, because if today were my last, I'm pretty sure I wouldn't bother preparing lectures for Wonersh or going shopping. Yet these things must happen. Perhaps another parable of our Lord's may help; happy the servant whose master's return finds him at his employment. That suggests that the best way to prepare for our Lord's coming is to carry on with our ordinary lives, doing all things to the best of our ability.

There is a cartoon showing two priests, one saying to the other 'The Lord has returned! What should we do?' The other replies 'Look busy!'
