### A short history of Advent

Advent is undoubtedly the warmest, homeliest of the liturgical seasons, so it may come as a surprise to learn that in the first few centuries of the Church's life. Christmas did not exist and neither did Advent. The only festival to be solemnly celebrated was the Resurrection. It was only in the 4th century in the West that the Church Christianised some of the festivals of popular culture. December being a dark and gloomy month became a time of celebrating Jesus, the Light of the World. The season of Advent was only added onto the Christmas cycle in the 6th century. From then on Advent became the start of the new liturgical year. How did this come about? Is Advent a time of penance or a season of joy? The Church itself has had some difficulty in finding a focus. In the early days of the missionary expansion in northern and western Europe, the emphasis was on the penitential character of Advent. It was seen as a time of spiritual discipline for all the faithful and of intense catechesis for those being initiated, through baptism on the Epiphany. However, in Rome itself the development of Advent was quite different. In Rome the feast of Epiphany was not a baptismal day, so preparation was unnecessary. Advent was seen as a preparation for the joyful season of Christmas, and so Advent, as developed in Rome, was characterised by festive joy. How could there not be joy in the anticipation of a birth, especially when the baby is the Son of God incarnate? By the early 12th century Roman custom and the Advent liturgy was festive and adorned in white and gold. The Gloria was sung and the joyful Alleluia remained in place. Sadly however, by the end of the century the pendulum had shifted and the liturgy was stripped of its festive elements, the Gloria was silenced, the colour of the vestments became black and the mood was decidedly much more sombre. What of todays practice? It seems that we still have difficulties with Advent and how it should be approached. A time of penitence or a time of joy? The season seems to be caught in a collision of conflicting interpretations and practices which continue to make it a difficult season to manage, a situation presenting some difficulty to priests, musicians and liturgical planners. Rather than focusing on difficulties, the wise priests and liturgists should see Advent as a season pregnant with possibility. Surely it is not a good idea to make Advent a little Lent in December. In the contemporary western world with all its pre-Christmas frenzy, the more appropriate approach is; "reflect, pray, take time to be still and rejoice for we are about to celebrate the birth of all births...." In the poorer countries of the world there is already so much enforced hardship that a season of joy and hope should make a pleasant relief. Unaware that Advent has had a curious development down through the centuries. Christians continue to celebrate some beautiful customs, though unless priests, teachers and liturgists make supreme efforts to constantly promote these, they could well be in danger of being swallowed up in the great shopping madness that seems all too prevalent on the four Advents Sundays and weekdays.

### A.C.T.A.( A Call to Action)

The National body of A.C.T.A. have collected over 1500 signatures expressing dissatisfaction with the present wording of the Mass, objecting to its "Latinate sentence construction, obscure vocabulary, excessively long sentences with too many subordinate clauses, loss of ecumenically shared texts which lacks inclusive language, clunky disjointed rhythms which do not serve proclamation- and

little has changed to reconcile many in the pews or indeed the majority of priests to the Vox Clara texts". Many of you have already voiced similar complaints as well. The ACTA lay delegates hope to present their findings to the Conference of Bishops of England & Wales asking them for a review of the present wording of the Mass. It would seem the Catholic church in Germany has had some success in preventing it's implementation.

#### **Electric Generator**

On Tuesday a major fault developed with the electric generator which is situated along the path next to the church . The Electricity Board asked permission to install a temporary mobile generator on the grounds of our church until they are able to repair the existing generator which may take up to a month or longer. Refusing permission would have meant no electricity being supplied to guite a considerable number of homes on Caterham on the Hill, including the church, right through the Christmas period. The only place they could park the temporary generator was on the disabled car park bay, as you can see. For the time being, could those who use this disabled car park space, please park on the driveway leading to the cottage next to the side entrance to the church. The tenants in the Cottage do not own a car, so don't feel you may be blocking anyone in.
