#### **Gospel Reflection**

The resonances of today's Gospel are most important. To begin with, we have the frank acknowledgement of St John the Baptist that in our Lord is his own mission completed; it was to announce the coming of our Lord that he carried out his own work of encouraging repentance among the people of Israel. He clearly acknowledges before his own followers that Jesus is the Messiah, by implication suggesting that they should follow Jesus now, since his own mission had been superseded.

The title that John uses for our Lord, that of 'Lamb of God' is one that would have had great significance for his hearers. First, they would have thought of the 'lamb whom God would provide' when Abraham was going to sacrifice his son Isaac on the mountain that would become Jerusalem, secondly they would have thought of the Passover lamb that was sacrificed each year as a remembrance of freedom from slavery under Pharaoh, thirdly, they would have thought of the 'scapegoat'; the goat or sheep on whom all the sins of the people of Israel were laid. A little thought will show how all these images are laden with meaning when considered as 'types', or foreshadowings of our Lord.

There are, of course, resonances that this phrase should have for us, too; Jesus is revealed to our sight, as he was to those early disciples of John the Baptist, as the priest shows us the sacred Host and says 'This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world'. For this reason, and for many others, we, too, should receive the Lord from a position of having repented our sins, ideally in sacramental confession. This attitude is the only one in which the Lord will give his grace to us; that grace we need for our growth in holiness, and, ultimately salvation.

Lastly, we have the acknowledgment of our Lord's messiahship by John, that same John who in his own person brought to an end the long and noble history of Old Testament prophecy. With these words, he, as it were, closes the books of the Old Testament since the one whom they were preparing for had now come among them.


#### Parish Film Club (SVP)
