Psalter week 1 <u>NEXT WEEK'S READINGS</u> Christ the King Dan 7:13-14 Ps 93:1a, 1b-2, 5 Rev 1:5-8 John 18:33b-37

The man with a sandwich board, pacing up and down the pavement, shouting 'the end of the world is at hand; prepare to meet thy doom' is a familiar figure, at least in legend. And the enemies of Christianity have often used figures like that to ridicule our faith. Several times in the Christian era have people claimed to have special knowledge of the last day, and have gathered their credulous disciples together, only to suffer a terrible disappointment. Who was it inspired them to pass on these messages? Sometimes, no doubt, the cause was simple mental instability on the part of the supposed visionary, and perhaps on the part of his or her followers also. At other times, one must not exclude the possibility of demonic manipulation for the purpose of discrediting the faith. These groups have not always been Protestant, either; some of the so-called Marian apparitions have also, under the guise of a certain number of good works, smuggled in some very doubtful doctrines as well as inaccurate information about the end of the world.

Let us be clear: the moment somebody claims special knowledge about the date of the end of the world, you can absolutely and certainly know that that person is either deluded (let us be charitable) or (to be less charitable) an out-and-out fake. How? Well, the answer is in today's Gospel, in that very last sentence. Not even Christ our Lord knows the date of the end of the world (at least in His human person). Is Almighty God going to reveal to some individual on earth that which He kept from His own Son? No, for nobody knows it: neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.

And this is as it should be; for if we know the date of the end, then there would be no motivation for doing good in the meantime. All we really need to know is that, certainly, one day we shall die; that is very certain, and we do not know the day nor the hour of that either. Perhaps in God's providence, that hour will coincide with the end of the world. Does it matter?

The only solution is, of course, to live every day as if it were our last, as many of the saints recommend; to have our spiritual bags packed, as it were, all the time, ready to depart. St Paul, echoing our Lord, warns us elsewhere that he may come 'like a thief in the night' (1Thess.5:2) and our Lord Himself counsels us to 'stay awake; stand ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour that we do not expect.' That's sound advice, from the best of all possible advisers. (Matt. 24:44).

Sanctuary Restoration

The results of our parish consultation are now in. Those in favour of the restoration numbered 154 votes; those not in favour numbered 3 votes. Many



thanks to all who participated.

On Tuesday, I, with Geoff Walker, chair of our Finance Committee; Deirdre Waddington and Greg Bratza, architects, presented our project to the Southern Historic Churches Commission, and they too approved our project, unanimously. There being no further official hurdles, we have accepted the proposal by Hirst Conservation to complete the work, which, we anticipate will begin in the very near future. Hirst have completed a similar project on wall paintings by the same artist only two years ago, and so are well equipped to undertake our restoration.

The first stage will be to examine the present state of the paintings, and also the underlying wall condition, to determine what precise remedies may be applied to secure the paintings for another generation. You will understand that the works, which will be going on for many months, will mean some disruption to our worship in the church. We aim to keep this to a minimum, and specifically to avoid the wedding season, for obvious reasons, since it will be necessary to erect scaffolding in the sanctuary, perhaps for several weeks. I am going to look at the best way in which we may preserve the life of our parish as the work proceeds: in particular concerning the reservation of the Blessed Sacrament. For the most part, Masses should not be disturbed: the Latin Mass can be celebrated on the forward altar without difficulty.

I would like to express my thanks to the many of you who have contributed so far to this project. And for now, all I can say is..... here we go!

World Youth Day: The next World Youth Day will be celebrated in Krakow, in July 2016. Young people 15-30 can go in a group; 18-30 as individuals. The cost will be £450, all-inclusive. On a similar theme, our parish seems not to have a tradition (recently anyway) of getting involved in the annual diocesan pilgrimage to Lourdes. Would there be interest for this coming year? The A&B pilgrimage is generally acknowledged to be one of the best available; there are places for able pilgrims as well as the sick. There are places for those who want to work with the sick (one of the best ways to make the pilgrimage), doctors and nurses (of whom we have plenty in our parish) being particularly welcome. There is a children's group, to enable parents to participate without having to constantly manage their childcare. There is a particular role for the 16-18 age group, the 'redshirts', for which there is fierce competition for places. The cost tends to be in the £600-700 range, but there is plenty of time now to start raising money. Sick people and the young should not let cost be a reason not to go: the parish will help if necessary.
