Forgiveness

### 2 Samuel 12:7-10,13

Through Nathan, God touches David's heart by showing how his selfish action had insulted his maker and sustainer. It says a lot for David's character, that he did not lose his temper and banish Nathan, or try to excuse himself or shift the blame. Very simply, and in sorrow, he admits his guilt; immediately this opens God's

forgiving heart. No one is ever too far entrenched in sin to be forgiven, provided they turn to Christ in contrition and are committed to making amends wherever possible. Forgiveness will always involve living differently in the future: if we have no intention of changing our behavior, then we have not really repented at all.

### Galatians 2:16,19-21

Paul had been a very committed and conscientious rabbi, following the law astutely. He is therefore well qualified to speak on this question bothering the Galatians: the importance of the Law in being saved and liberated from one's sins. If anyone could find salvation by strict adherence to God's Mosaic Law, it would be Paul himself. Yet he confidently asserts the Law, though valuable as a guideline, creates its own type of prison; for although it suggests a good, noble and godly way of living, it does not provide the strength and power which weak humanity desperately needs in order to achieve such a life. With the coming of Jesus Christ, all this changed. God, humbling himself in becoming man, accepts the duties and confines of the Law, but also breaks through them to suffuse them with his own life and power. So, when we accept Christ, we too are enabled to plug into that power which can at last take us just as we are, without pretence, and make us new creatures, able to do all things; for it is no longer us, but Christ alive and working in us and through us.

### Luke 7:36-8:3

Simon the Pharisee is a respected and honourable man, dutiful and fully committed to leading a good life. We may wonder what prompted him to invite Jesus to a meal at his house. Perhaps this surprisingly wise teacher from Nazareth spoke words so profound that he wanted to know more of him; perhaps he was merely sounding out a man whom people were beginning to claim as a prophet. His lack of courtesy suggests that he did not rank Jesus as anyone very important. Whatever his reasons, he is certainly taken aback when Jesus seems quite unembarrassed by the attentions of a woman of bad reputation. The incident makes his suspect that Jesus may be an imposter. Jesus' response, however, proves him to be a prophet whose vision is wider and more fundamentally satisfying and practical than any before him. Simon is led to the point where he can see the link between love and forgiveness. The Law went hand in hand with condemnation; Jesus brings it to life with reconciliation.

### **Mass Intentions**

Could I ask those intending to have a Mass said on the anniversary of the deceased to try and book this at least two months in advance with the Parish Secretary in the Office. It would help ease some of the backlog of Masses still waiting to be said.

Have you considered having Masses said for yourself after your death? Include this intention in your will.

Somebody asked me what is a Foundation Mass? For every offering of £100 made to the Diocesan Trustees, under this arrangement an annual Mass will be celebrated for 25 years for the intention of the donor.
