The Catenians

The Catenian Association is a non-political international Association of practising Catholic business and professional men. It exists to provide mutual support to its members and their families, to maintain benevolent funds and to help young Catholics in their choice and pursuit of a career. Catenians are known to each other as "brother" and this is symbolic of the way in which they view and help each other. In the early 20th century, there were fewer than two million Catholics in England and many were still viewed with a certain amount of distrust by their neighbours. In 1906, the government had declared that it was going to banish voluntary schools, many of which would have invariably been Catholic. The Bishop of Salford, Louis Casartelli, had been encouraged by the fact that more and more Catholics were entering the middle classes and he knew that education was a major component in this. He was appalled by the government's proposals and decided to take action. He was a popular bishop and his stance was applauded by the vast majority of Catholics. In 1906, he formed the Catholic Federation, in order to oppose the measures, and he and the members were eventually successful. Many of those who had joined the Federation found real fellowship and a sense of purpose there and in 1908, they formed another organisation known as The Churris Benevolent Association. In 1910, the name was changed to the Catenian Association, taking it's title from the latin word for chain, catena. Today there 10,000 members in the following countries: Great Britain.; Ireland; Australia; Malta; South Africa; Zambia; Zimbabwe and in recent years India. Each group is part of a circle and these circles are grouped into provinces. Each province has a director who serves on the Grand Council and from these a Grand President is elected annually. Prayer is very important to the Catenians and every meetings begins and ends with prayer. The Association has three patron saints: St Peter, St Paul and St Thomas More. Their moto is: "strengthening family life through friendship and faith". Their logo depicts a Maltese Cross, chosen as it is a sign of the Catholic order, the Knights of Malta, inside a chain comprised of strong links. Each year, groups choose a local charity to support, and although they are not a money raising group, they regularly manage to raise three guarters of a million pounds for these local charities. The Catenians also administer a Bursary Fund, which began officially in 1991. This gave grants to young Catholics between the ages of 16 and 24 to take part in community based projects at home and abroad; helping those who are in need. One area the Catenians are very strong in their belief and support is that of vocations to the Priesthood. Every Catenian province in the country has a liaison officer, who maintains contact with the local diocesan vocations director and every year a donation is made towards this work. Prayers are said for vocations at every meeting and every circle is given a date on which they are encouraged to hold a Mass for Vocations. This means that in almost every day of the year, a Mass is being said somewhere for vocations to the Priesthood by the Catenians. There is no doubt the Catenians do much valuable work on behalf of the Church. However there is also time for socialising and it is important that members regularly meet in order to share fellowship and bring their families together. A conference is held every year in different venues around the country. Wives and partners go along and there is much laughter and talk, as new friendship are formed and old ones revitalised. There is also a Catenian Golf Society. In addition there is a Catenian Caravanning Fellowship and this enormously popular with members and their families. The Catenians regularly visit Walsingham and every other year, a trip to Rome is undertaken. The Catenians began as a response to times in which the Catholics were often isolated. Thankfully those days are passed but there are new pressures i.e. trying to live a life of faith in an increasing secular society. The Association allows men to come together, to form bonds of fellowship and to support the needs of the Church and her clergy.
