First Sunday in Advent Isaiah 2:1-5 Romans 13:11-14 Matthew 24:37-44

Gospel Reflection

When thinking about the Kingdom of God, people have been often tempted to see it in one of two ways. The first, and most common, is that expressed by the good thief in today's Gospel; 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your Kingdom'. This implies that the Kingdom of God is some time in the future, something that we will experience when we die, and not before. On the other hand, there have been attempts down through the ages to make the Kingdom of God realizable in the here and now; there were some misguided Crusader efforts in the middle ages to bring it about by forcibly converting the Jews, and, in our own time, some 'liberation' theologians sought to create it in Latin America by the creation of an 'ideal' society along marxist lines. It is true that both opinions can claim a certain amount of support from the words of our Lord himself: 'My kingdom is not of this world', he says, (John 18:36). But elsewhere he says 'the kingdom of God is in the midst of you.' (Luke 17:21) How are we to reconcile this apparent contradiction?

There may be a possible answer by analogy with a sacrament. We remember that a sacrament is a means of making something present and active which otherwise could not be made so, by reason of its nature (a spiritual one, for instance), by means of something else, usually with a physical nature. The sacrament of the Eucharist, for instance, makes present the risen and ascended Lord Jesus under the forms of bread and wine. The presence of our Lord is a true and real one, though sacramental; not corresponding to our laws of physics. In the same way, we might say that the Kingdom of God is quasi-sacramentally present, above all in the Church; we are those who have died to the Kingdom of this world, where this world's rules are obeyed, and now live, insofar as we can, in the Kingdom of God. Inevitably, because of our sinfulness and our weak wills, we live with one foot in the Kingdom of God and one foot in the Kingdom of this world (and so, of course, does the Church). The idea is to spend this life trying, with God's grace, to live more and more in the Kingdom of God, so that when we die, passing from the shadowy images of the Kingdom into its truth and fullness, the changeover should be almost imperceptible to the soul who is already in union with its maker.

So the Kingdom of God does exist insofar as we live in it, but its true fullness lies in the future, when Christ shall be all in all. We are now true citizens of the Kingdom of God, but the fullness of this dignity will only be realized when, like the good thief, we are with the Lord in paradise.

There will be a talk on behalf of Parishes for Peace given by Carmen Narbona from Weybridge Parish, supported by Aidan Cantwell from Arundel and Brighton Diocese in the Old Hall immediately following Mass on Friday Dec 2nd at 7.30pm. All are welcome.

The objective of Parishes for Peace is to link parishes in the UK with Catholic parishes in Jordan who are giving shelter and sup-

port to about 7000 Christian refugees ejected from Mosul in Iraq by Isis.

Christians were given as little as 2 hours to convert, leave Mosul or die. After abandoning their homes they were given sanctuary by the King of Jordan. At first they were housed in portakabins in church car parks. Now they are living in cramped accommodation in Amman and other Jordanian towns in Catholic parishes. Refugee camps are not considered safe for them so they fall through the net of the large charities.

Parishes for Peace is trying to link Jordanian parishes directly with UK parishes. The Iragis are not allowed to work so parishes here raise funds for food, personal expenses, electricity, water and English lessons.

"Just to know that there are Christians in the UK who pray for them is a great consolation."
