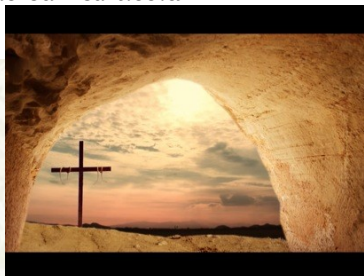

Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, our Lord speaks of the entirely new nature that we have received as a result of his death and resurrection. It is something that is, perhaps, most astonishing in God's mercy that we have not simply been restored by grace to the unfallen state of our first parents, but given something far better: we have been taken into the very life of the Trinity itself.

We understand that, by grace, especially through the sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist, we become the Mystical Body of Christ—in a real sense we become identified with the Lord himself; God the Father looks on us and sees his beloved Son. This is how we speak of ourselves as the adopted children of God; in today's Gospel, our Lord says 'you will understand that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you'. This, too, is why our Lord promises us the Holy Spirit, for the Holy Spirit is, as it were, the soul of the Mystical Body, which binds us even further into the mystery of the Trinity. This is something that, even in their natural perfection, Adam and Eve lacked and which even the angels might envy.

There is, though, a corresponding moral requirement that we behave appropriately with regard to this relationship. There is a real expectation that, if we are the Mystical Body of Christ, we should behave as if we were. 'Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me, and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him'. This new life is something not just for the future, but is ours even now; and this means that we should determine to live virtuously not just in the future, but right from today.

Refugees in Madaba. Our recent gift of £2,000 to Madaba was distributed as follows: About £500 went to refugee families previously identified by Parishes for Peace as in need of support; Fr. Eyad Bader distributed £1,000 to additional refugee families he knows need assistance. £500 went to Raidah Farah who teaches at St John's School to help children in need of help with uniform, school fees and books. Our next donation will be taken to Jordan by Mike and Eliz Wood.

They are joining a group organised by Parishes for Peace visiting Madaba in early June.
