Gospel Reflection

We know from contemporary documents (such as the Dead Sea scrolls) that many of the rabbis in our Lord's time were expecting the Messiah to put in an appearance about then. We don't know all their criteria—though we do know some, such as their expectation that the Messiah would be born at Bethlehem—but there was certainly an air of expectancy about. For this reason there were some who either deluded themselves or deluded others that they were in fact the Messiah; Herod Agrippa was one such—a descendent of Herod the Great, of Holy Innocents fame,—a kinglet, who had actually managed to get himself born at Bethlehem; a fact which, no doubt, put the Messiah idea into his head in the first place. The point is that, although we know that our Lord did fulfil all the criteria, it didn't look that way to his critics. His Galilean background (with perhaps a Galilean accent), though clearly fulfilling the prophecy quoted in today's first reading, and also alluded to in today's Gospel, seemed to be an insuperable obstacle to any one who did not know that he was born in Bethlehem and was in fact of sound Judæan stock. In this we can clearly see the providence of God, for he was able, after his turbulent first few months of life, to develop normally and, with respect to his human nature, mature as much like any other child as possible. Galilee had other advantages, also; it was much more racially diverse than Judea; indeed many contemporary Jews regarded it as suspect for this reason, but this meant that our Lord (of course!) but, more crucially, his Galilean apostles who were to be the foundation stones of his Church had little or no anti-Gentile prejudice. It is also significant that he began his ministry there, to people of mixed race, before going to Judea and Jerusalem; a sign that the Gospel is something not confined to one race or nation, as the Jewish faith had been, but was for all human beings, irrespective of their background.

This is something that comes home again and again as one looks around at one's neighbours at Mass; truly we are blessed that our Faith is something that transcends nation and race, and we can thus regard in a real way as brothers and sisters those whose backgrounds are so very different to ours, and can be reminded of the words of our Lord: *And men will come from east and west, and from north and south, and sit at table in the kingdom of God.* (Luke ;29)



Parishes for Peace

The objective of **Parishes for Peace** is to link parishes in the UK with Catholic parishes in Jordan who are giving shelter and support to about 7000 Christian refugees ejected from Mosul in Iraq by Isis. The Iraqis are not allowed to work so parishes here raise funds for food, personal expenses, electricity, water and English lessons.

The Iraqi Christians were given as little as 2 hours to convert to Islam, leave Mosul or die. After abandoning their homes they were given sanctuary by the King of Jordan. At first they were housed in portakabins in church car parks. Now they are living in cramped accommodation in Catholic parishes in Amman and other Jordanian towns. Refugee camps are not considered safe for Christians so they fall through the net of help from the large charities.

Della Shenton, the founder of Parishes for Peace has since offered to facilitate a link between the Sacred Heart parish and a group of the Christian refugees living in Madaba in Jordan. They are actively supported by an English speaking Parish Priest Fr Eyad.

'The Parish of St John is looking after about 110 Christian families. We can help by working with the parish and Fr Eyad to raise money and work with the families. We can also help by befriending them, writing to them and letting them know that we are thinking and praying for them.

"Just to know that there are Christians in the UK who pray for them is a great consolation"

They need food and help with basic medical needs. Free medical attention is available but the waiting time is so long that urgent treatment, particularly for the children, has to be paid for privately. The cost is £30 per visit. Then there are medicines to buy.'(Della Shenton).

How can we help our fellow Christians in Madaba?

- After masses next Sunday, Jan 29th, there will be a collection to assist the Christians in Madaba. We intend to send £800 immediately to Fr Eyad Bader the parish priest of St John the Baptist, asking him to distribute the funds for the food and medical needs of his congregation.
- We already have £350 from the collection at the Carol Service in December. Any additional amount raised will be retained until we receive further information about the needs of the Christians in Madaba.
- The £800 will be given to Fr Eyad by a group from Weybridge parish who are travelling to Jordan on Feb 2nd and will be staying in Madaba.
