GOSPEL REFLECTION

Our Lord's lightening wit in today's Gospel enables him to easily sidestep a trap laid for him; a clever trap, too. He is asked a seemingly innocent question: Is it permissible to pay taxes to Cæsar? But it is an important question, because if one were to pay taxes, it implies that one recognizes the legitimacy of the authority of those whom one pays. And the Pharisees made sure that there was an audience to hear what our Lord's reply would be. Should our Lord suggest that taxes should not be paid to Cæsar, his words would be heard by the Herodians—we might call them collaborators; those who were reliant on the Roman occupiers for their position,—and our Lord would be seen as a fomentor of rebellion and possibly arrested. If, on the other hand, our Lord agreed that it was legitimate to pay taxes, the Pharisees would have been able to have him rejected as a heretic by those who resented the Gentile domination of the Holy Land.

Our Lord, however, does not merely sidestep their trap, but uses it as an opportunity to give another teaching on the Kingdom of God. His attitude essentially is one of indifference as to who bears the earthly rule and to whom one should pay taxes; what is of crucial importance is the heavenly Kingdom and our duties there; our ultimate future is unlikely to be affected much by the nature of the civil authorities where we live, but will be very much affected by the zeal with which we have kept the commandments and performed the works of mercy.
