Gospel Reflection

It's an old joke: 'I'm a self-made man, and I worship my maker'. The instinct towards self-reliance is a very human one and in fact lies at the root of our alienation from God. The desire for power over our own and others' lives seems to be something we prize above all other things. Consequently, the acceptance of the concept that another might a greater say than we about the way we live our own lives is not a comfortable thought. It smacks of totalitarianism, of slavery, of so many things that our liberal western society regards as real evils—often with justification. This feeling that I ought, by my very nature, to be in control of my own destiny, consulting only my own wishes, accounts, perhaps, for the very many people who choose to live their lives without God rather than have to endure restrictions on their absolute liberty of action. For modern man, there is no 'ought', no 'should' other than desire and what is physically possible. But the greatest slavery, the greatest tyrrany, is that which is within, and which subjects our reason, and our true freedom, to our own appetites, when the illusion that we are pleasing ourselves becomes so convincing that our power to choose to do something or not to do something has entirely vanished, to be replaced simply with addiction. Christianity is about surrendering our control over even our own lives to the one who knows best how to run things, and trusting him to see us safe to our destinations. Of ourselves, we cannot get there; his grace will do all that we need. Our salvation is not dependent on working hard, even at virtue, but on the free grace of our Lord with which we co-operate in our good works. And for this, the crucial virtue of humility is absolutely essential. It was Satan who said non serviam; I will not serve. Our Lady said 'Let it be done to me according to thy will'. This is why the tax-collector was justified, and the Pharisee was not.
