# If we suffer with Christ we shall also live with him

### Zechariah 12:10-11; 13:1

This prophecy looks forward to the suffering of God's chosen one, which will release a new spirit of kindness and prayer among his people, even though they have been instrumental in his death. In their guilt and grief they suffer with him, and having made themselves receptive, can be remade as his own people.

# Galatians 3:26-29

Paul is stressing here the new-found unity which is a direct result of belonging to Christ. Baptism is like a kind of dying, in that it is a complete break with the world's categorising, compartmentalised society, divisive by its very nature. New life in Christ is not the old with a few 'extras' thrown in; it is a complete remaking - more like a caterpillar's transformation into a butterfly.

We are often happiest with things as they are; reluctant to alter what we know and understand, even if there are difficulties. Yet we must risk ourselves with Christ if he is to change us.

# Luke 9:18-24

Not surprisingly, when the people were faced with the promised Christ in person, they were full of suggestions about his identity which would not demand too shattering a change to their lives and beliefs.

When Peter acknowledged Christ as God's chosen one, he was taking a tremendous risk. After all, at this stage there had been no resurrection, and Jesus looked and functioned in a perfectly normal way. To acknowledge Jesus as 'the Christ of God' meant unavoidable and radical change in Peter. The years of waiting had a certain safety about them, but if the Messiah was actually there standing next to him, the waiting was over and man had entered a new phase in his relationship with God.

Straight away, Jesus speaks of the inevitable action of suffering and death. There is no possible way to save the world other than the creator himself submitting to his creation in an entire self-offering of love.

### CAFOD Syria Update

Thank you for responding so generously to the CAFOD's Syria appeal. £1.5m was raised from the Catholic community of England and Wales. We are working with with trusted Church partners in Syria who are providing food parcels, medical aid and relief supplies, and helping people to find safe places to stay. We are also working in Lebanon, Turkey and Jordan to ensure that newly arrived refugees have food, medical support, clothes and safe places in which to take shelter. Please continue to pray for the people of Syria and for our local partners who are working to alleviate their suffering.

### St Francis School Applications

Those intending to apply for St Francis School later this year are reminded that the first criteria of precedence for entry in relation to the Priest's reference is given to those who attend Mass weekly or at least 3 times within each of the calendar months throughout the year. Please also note: Having a Sibling already within the school is no longer deemed a priori for admittance. 
