In July of this year, Pope Francis made his first visit as the newly elected Pope to the island of Lampedusa. It was his first official visit outside of Rome. This island is closer to Africa than to Europe and has long been the first arrival point in Europe for thousands of African Boat people or illegal economic migrants. The first time that the Church in Rome became involved in a Christian community outside its boundaries took place in the year 95 AD. A letter from Rome was sent to the Church in Corinth to deal with Church order. Some priests at Corinth had been unceremoniously removed from office and the Church in Rome intervened on their behalf. This letter was greatly revered in the early Church and in some places was even read aloud at the Sunday Eucharist. Traditionally the letter has been attributed to Pope Clement, the fourth Bishop of Rome. It is not known whether the Church in Corinth appealed to Rome to intervene or whether Rome itself took the initiative. In any case, the letter provides firm evidence that Rome believed it had the authority to deal with such matters. It seems more likely that Rome was asked to intervene. At that time, the Apostle John was still alive, yet the appeal was made to Rome rather than to John. Perhaps this was the earliest evidence of an emerging recognition of Roman primacy. Clement's letter implies that a Council of Bishops governed the Christian community of the later fourth century Rome. Clement may well have been the senior Bishop serving the Church in Rome and he may also have been specially charged with the task of overseeing Rome's relations with other Churches. The Council of Bishops then is probably along similar lines that Pope Francis had in mind in when appointing a Council of Cardinals - outside the Curia - to be his special advisers. It would be totally misleading however to think that Pope Clement in 95AD exercised his office in a way resembling the modern Papacy. The Church of Rome in Clements's time began to see that whatever befell a single cell of the Christian community, such as Corinth, ultimately affected the entire body. It intervened at Corinth because it understood the grave consequence that divisions at the local level could have for the Church throughout the world. Pope Francis intervention at Lampedusa came about by invitation from the local parish priest within days of his election but the visit was kept quiet. He concelebrated Mass with the local Bishop and the Parish priest only. No Cardinals nor politicians were invited. Recalling that more than twenty thousand migrants were thought to have perished in attempted crossing from Africa to Europe over the last twenty years, the Pope asked: Who is responsible for the loss of so many lives? Nobody! That is our answer. He compared the fate of the African boat people to the parable of the Good Samaritan. People were ready to feel sympathy but no practical help. Pope Francis, had flown to Lampedusa from Rome, then transferred on arrival to a coastguard boat and sailed into the harbour as so many migrants had done or tried in vain to do. When he arrived in port, Francis stopped to talk to some of the one hundred and sixty Africans from Eritrea who had landed there some hours earlier. Before alighting from the boat, Francis threw a wreath of yellow and white chrysanthemums into the sea in memory of the dead. He celebrated Mass on an improvised altar and used a Lampedusa fishing boat as his chair while the lectern used for the Scripture Readings was made from bits of wood taken from the remains of some of the rickety boats in which the migrants arrived.


Caterham Food Bank
