Gospel Reflection

Schadenfreude, the Germans call it: the sort of illicit pleasure people feel at seeing other made ridiculous or brought low. Today's rather puzzling parable seems from an earthly point of view rather unjust; those who had laboured all the day no doubt saw the later arrivals with a certain pleasure, believing that either the newcomers were going to receive less than themselves, or that they themselves would receive more. Such is the way we would normally arrange things. But our Lord's parable is not to encourage people to come as early as possible in order to get the greatest reward, rather, it is pointing out the mean attitude of those who will not be satisfied with their reward, but desire also the humiliation, or the lower station, of others.

Literature has many examples of those who delight more in the damnation of their neighbour than in their own presumed salvation. Calvinists tend to bear the brunt of this particular attack, but although we Catholics are by the grace of God less prone to this particular fault, nonetheless it is not entirely absent from our ranks; for instance, I (a cradle Catholic) have once or twice (not more) heard people disparaging converts as 'not the real thing'. What is the real thing, though? Surely the true Christian, the true Catholic, is only the one whom the Lord admits to salvation, and neither the convert nor the cradle Catholic can say for sure whether he or she will be one of those elect. That, as the Gospel suggests, is our Lord's matter, and if he chooses to extend salvation even to one who 'between the stirrup and the ground...mercy sought and mercy found' what is that to us? We should rather look to ourselves and to our salvation, and know that our Lord values Charity more highly than any other virtue.
