Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, our Lord urges his followers to have courage when it comes to speaking the truth. In this passage we understand that to proclaim what Christ has taught us is the function of the Church par excellence, and if of the Church in general, then of us in particular. He also urges us to be unafraid even of martyrdom, for those who would oppress us can only kill the body: eternal life is worth far more than that. Our Lord clearly draws up the battle-lines; we must be either for him, or else we are against him, and if we are ashamed of our faith, then he will also be ashamed of us.

There is such an urge to conform in the present world; while a great deal of lipservice is paid to those who swim against the current or refuse to run with the herd, in practice there has never been an age of such conformity. In saying that people want to be individual, they end up looking like everyone else. As some writer or other has said: 'revolution inevitably becomes the new conformity'. The Christian who never admits to being a Christian may as well not be a Christian as far as his neighbour—whom he may well have saved with a little trouble—is concerned. And, we may infer from today's Gospel, as far as our Lord is concerned, more to the point.

The second reading is one of the more significant passages in the letters of St Paul, and it repays some careful reading, since (as so often with this writer) sometimes his thoughts go faster than his words, and you have to reflect a bit to find out just what he is trying to say. His first point is that death came into the world because someone ('Adam') broke the higher Law of God's will, not because he transgressed the Law of Moses. Jewish converts had criticized the early Gentile Christians for not keeping the Law of Moses, but St Paul is pointing to the higher Law above and beyond it. Just as the Mosaic Law cannot bring death, so it cannot bring life either. But the new covenant brought by Jesus can. Our Lord is the new Adam, reversing what Adam did, and did not come to enforce the law of Moses, but to bring life in its fullness. What he has done by his passion, death and resurrection has not just undone the fall brought about by Adam, but 'considerably outweighed' it.

If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.
