NEXT WEEK'S READINGS

First Sunday of Lent Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7 Romans 5:12-19 Matthew 4:1-11

Don't worry; be happy! What a world of optimism is in those four words. Some people are lucky enough to have that attitude without even having to work at it. For the rest of us poor mortals, with mortgages, tax returns, rising prices of fuel and everything else, worry can be the normal state of affairs, even when we aren't naturally disposed that way.

As life gets ever more complicated, there are ever more things to get worried about. And yet, I suppose, if we are the sorts of people who naturally tend to worry we will always find something to nag at us, were we to live the simplest life. When a person is worrying or fretting, usually the last thing you can usefully say to them is 'stop worrying'. Worry is mostly a feeling, even if it may have an external cause, and we can't turn our feelings on and off like a tap.

At least we can't at that particular time. But we can learn good habits, and a habit of trust and even of optimism is something we can acquire over time. Like all virtues, it takes a long time, but it's worth getting. As our Lord says in today's Gospel, worry is something that does no good at all in itself. It simply leaves us less able to cope with a problematic situation. A calm head is usually the best way to handle even the most troubled happening. Running round like a headless chicken achieves little.

I do not think our Lord is telling us to take no thought for the practicalities of life; that would be very irresponsible in someone who has, say, responsibility for others, such as a parent. He is saying that material things are not where we should focus, but rather we should remember what things are really about: the kingdom of God and his righteousness. Which is to say that we would be best advised to concentrate on those things which pertain to God's kingdom; peace, justice, virtue and all the rest. If we are the sorts of people who set these things as priorities, we are very unlikely to lack the other necessities of life. We may not have them in extravagant abundance, but we will always have enough to be happy.

It is always a good idea to remember the purpose of what we are doing, of how we are living; to lift up our eyes beyond the limitations of the next shop at Morrison's, and try to see the eternal hills of the kingdom of heaven.
