Gospel Reflection

Many a novel and film has featured the classic scene of the death-bed conversion. The old rascal receiving absolution after a lifetime of dissipation makes for good drama.

Thanks be to God, such happy endings are not confined to fiction. It really is never too late, in this life, to repent, and the shadow of death does sometimes encourage people to respond to that Divine Grace which dissolves the bonds of a lifetime of sin in an instant. We should never begrudge such blessings. Each one of us is in such need of God's grace that we should rejoice whenever, and to whomever, it is given.

Deliberately to leave everything to the last minute, however, would be like playing Russian Roulette with our immortal souls. Our Lord reminds us over and again that we do not know the day when we shall be called to account. The spectre of terrorism in the modern world should reinforce in us the realisation that death might overtake us at any moment.

Beginning Advent on such a note is not to cast a pall of gloom over the forthcoming celebration of Christmas. The coming of Our Lord into our hearts at Baptism means that we have the beginning of eternal life already within us. In this light, death becomes just the final bridge to be crossed before we find ourselves safely on terra firma, forever.

The message of today's Gospel is to "stand firm" in that baptismal grace. Advent is a time to reflect on how to readjust our priorities. If Our Lord were to return at this very moment, we should ask ourselves, how would He find us: totally lost in the pursuit of money and pleasure; or at least trying to make ourselves more faithful to His Gospel?

There will be a talk on behalf of **Parishes for Peace** given by Carmen Narbona from Weybridge Parish, supported by Aidan Cantwell from Arundel and



Brighton Diocese in the Old Hall immediately following Mass on Friday Dec 2nd at 7.30pm. All are welcome.

The objective of Parishes for Peace is to link parishes in the UK with Catholic parishes in Jordan who are giving shelter and support to about 7000 Christian refugees ejected from Mosul in Iraq by Isis.

Christians were given as little as 2 hours to convert, leave Mosul or die. After abandoning their homes they were given sanctuary by the King of Jordan. At first they were housed in portakabins in church car parks. Now they are living in cramped accommodation in Amman and other Jordanian towns in Catholic parishes. Refugee camps are not considered safe for them so they fall through the net of the large charities.

Parishes for Peace is trying to link Jordanian parishes directly with UK parishes. The Iraqis are not allowed to work so parishes here raise funds for food, personal expenses, electricity, water and English lessons.

"Just to know that there are Christians in the UK who pray for them is a great consolation."
