Weekday 26 Year II Morning Prayer Psalter Week 2

Matthew 21:28-32

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people,

'What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He went and said to the first, "My boy, you go and work in the vineyard today." He answered, "I will not go," but afterwards thought better of it and went. The man then went and said the same thing to the second who answered, "Certainly, sir," but did not go. Which of the two did the father's will?' 'The first' they said. Jesus said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.'

Reflection

You can always change your mind: that is the good thing about the Christian religion. It is never too late, and sometimes changing our mind is the most humble, productive and wonderful thing to do.

Sometimes as a priest one can get a little depressed at the number of parents who cheerfully promise before God to bring their child up as a Catholic Christian at its baptism, intending perhaps to do no such thing, or at least interpreting 'bringing up their child as Catholic' in a sense very far from what the Church intends. There can be a lot of reasons for that, of course. Often there is a real intention that the child 'belong' in some sense to the Catholic Church, a desire that the child's identity, in however inchoate a way, should include at least some fragment of the family's social and religious history; sometimes the baptism is simply to please grandparents; or, lowest on the scale of acceptability, simply provide an occasion to have a party and 'wet the baby's head', welcome it, in other words.

To initiate life in the Kingdom of God, with all that means, but never to follow it through, or worse, to treat it simply as an occasion for a knees-up is very sad—some might even call it blasphemous. However—and it is a big however—we do understand that the sacraments work ex opere operato; which is to say that they 'work' irrespective of the bad dispositions (as long as they are not actually contrary dispositions) of those who bring it about. The child truly is a child of God, truly has received sacramental grace, truly is a Christian, and that grace will be available to the child through its life; all that is necessary is that he or she turn to God, make a good confession and start to live the sort of life that the original baptism implied. Which happens guite often, actually.

The message, then, of today's Gospel is that, put simply, the proof of the pudding is in the eating. Or as our Lord says elsewhere, (Matthew 7:21) It is not those who say to me 'Lord, Lord,' who will enter the kingdom of heaven, but those who do the will of my Father.
