
MARRIAGE PREPARATION DAY OF REFLECTION

GOSPEL REFLECTION

There is, as we know, a great proliferation of non-Catholic Christian communions; even counting those only whose existence derives from the Protestant reformation, there are many thousands. For the most part these differ from each other in their particular interpretation of the Bible, often over small things; in other words, they differ on matters of doctrine. Each person being free to interpret the word of God for him or herself, they coalesce into groups of people whose interpretation roughly coincides with their own and thus what is loosely called a 'church' is formed. We Catholics, on the other hand, do not find ourselves Catholics because the Catholic Church agrees with us, more or less, in our own interpretation of the Bible—though this may also be true. Rather, instead of looking to our own, necessarily limited, intellects alone, we seek to apply a key to understanding the scriptures authentically. Two contrary interpretations of an important text in the bible cannot both be true. If God's word is to be heard as he intends it to be heard, there has to be some means of objectively knowing what is meant. This is where the apostles come in, and their successors, the bishops who teach in what we call the Church, enlightened by sacred tradition. In other words, we belong to the Catholic Church not because it teaches things we agree with (many don't!), but because the Church is the means of teaching and knowing the truth.

In today's Gospel, our Lord points out something similar to the Pharisees. They were so busy insisting on the keeping of the minutiæ of individual rules that they had lost sight of what the rules were about. What makes one a good Jew, says our Lord, is not that one should keep this law and that law, but that rather one should love God and one's neighbour, of which fundamental laws the individual little laws were the normal expression. In other words, there is a deeper Law behind the outer laws to which one can appeal when the lesser laws seem inappropriate. This is what got our Lord into trouble, as when his disciples were picking ears of corn to eat on the Sabbath. (Matthew 12:1) Let us pray that our Lord will give us the grace always to be able to see the wood, and not just the trees.
