The Council of Trent

The Council began in 1545 and concluded in 1563. It may seem strange to a modern mind that Councils should take so long but some Councils even went on much longer often interrupted by wars or factions between European states. The Emperor Charles V had been trying for twenty years to get the Pope to call a Council to respond to the revolt led by Martin Luther which was tearing Europe apart. Charles had hoped that Luther and his followers would attend but by the time the Council actually began, it was far too late for that to happen. Positions had become entrenched and another major split within the Church was inevitable. Rulers were very active in influencing the course of religious events and even more so in trying to influence the agenda and decisions of Trent. In the course of the eighteen years the Council met for twenty five sessions. Hardly any of the substances discussed met with overall approval. Those born before 1963 will remember what came to be called the "Tridentine Mass" - this refers to the celebration of the Mass with all the prayers and scripture readings said or sung in Latin with the Priest facing the same way as the faithful. This was more or less the style used from the Council of Trent to the Second Vatican Council in 1963, a period of four hundred years. But one needs to look closely at the decrees of the Council of Trent itself to see what it had to say about the manner of the celebration of the Mass. Chapter 8 says : " Although the Mass is full of instruction for the faithful, the Council Fathers do not think it advantageous that it should everywhere be celebrated in the vernacular". Canon 9 repeated this in the negative form, " If anyone saysthat the Mass should be celebrated in the vernacular...let him be anathema". With these words Trent was simply saying - as against the claims of Luther and his followers - that the Latin Mass was legitimate! It did not condemn the vernacular Mass. For instance in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, the Mass was celebrated in many different languages in 1562. A few months earlier the catholic Duke of Albrecht sent two envoys to Rome to ask Pope Pius 1V for permission to receive the Chalice and also for certain lay members be allowed to perform certain ecclesiastical duties, especially preaching the divine Word. The Pope responded saying that the question of communion from the chalice was being considered by the Council and he did not want to interfere. The Spanish Bishops were passionately opposed, but no agreement was reached. It was decided to defer both questions for a later time. That time came at the Second Vatican Council for the reception of the chalice by the faithful but the question of lay preachers was very strictly restricted. At the end of the Council of Trent, Pope Pius 1V forbade the printing of commentaries or notes on the decrees of the Council. Forty years later, Pope Paul V collated all the material related to the Council into fifty volumes and stored them in the Vatican archives, where access to them was restricted for the next four hundred years. Only in 1880 - after the First Vatican Council - did Pope Leo X111 break this embargo. Pope Pius 1V in 1563 set up a body called the "Congregation of the Council" which continued to function until 1966 - to implement the decrees of Trent. This Congregation in true Curia fashion, promoted the impression that Trent answered all possible questions - even on subjects never addressed. It left little room for change, future development or adaption. The Roman Missal published in 1570 under Pope Pius V gave us the Tridentine Mass. The Papal command accompanying it ordered that this Missal be universally adopted and forbade anything be ever added or removed giving the impression that the Council had imposed a blanked rigidity on the celebration of the Mass which was clearly not the case.
