Gospel Reflection

Last week in the parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector, we were reminded of the necessity of the virtue of humility, and how no number of good works, however excellent in themselves, can save us without the necessary faith in God's own power to justify us.

This week Zacchaeus, another tax collector, does not just ask God's forgiveness, but expresses it in deeds of very real faith and repentance, demonstrating by his works the faith that has come to birth in his soul. We are reminded that God does not save us because of who we are, but rather because of who He is. Our membership of a particular group, be it by being a good-living Pharisee or even a member of the Catholic Church will not by itself guarantee our salvation; there has to be a real turning from sin and a determination to live a life of virtue, that life for which sanctifying grace is intended. This grace comes through the sacraments, but to be able to benefit from it we must determine to act according to the grace we receive. For instance, our sins are forgiven in the Sacrament of Penance, but only if there is a real 'purpose of amendment'; a true intention to do our best to avoid those sins in the future, even though we may guess that it is very likely that we will fail. So, the good works that we do as a sign of our faith are themselves the fruits of God's own grace and certainly require our cooperation.

This week we will be celebrating two major feasts: of All Saints and All Souls. These ought to remind us that we are on a journey the end of which is out of sight, but not out of our knowledge. It reminds us that we need to live as people whose true homeland is not here on earth, but in heaven where Christ is, at the right hand of the Father, and to pray that, as in the case of Zacchaeus, salvation might come to our house, that we, who are lost, might yet be found.

Or if in London join Pax Christi, CAFOD and the Council of Lutheran Churches in the UK for simultaneous prayer vigils for peace at the <u>Foreign Office</u> (junction of Whitehall and King Charles Street) or the <u>Russian Embassy</u> (6-7 Kensington Palace Gardens) between 4pm - 5pm

We will also pray for Syria and other areas of conflict and injustice on Friday 4th November at the Rosary for Peace 6.30pm. All welcome.
