Weekday 27 Year II Morning Prayer Psalter Week 3

Matthew 21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son" he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures:

It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone.

This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see?

'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'

Gospel Reflection

Matthew 21:33-43

This Sunday's Gospel, of the wicked vineyard tenants, can be said to have a lot of ramifications. One that might be worth considering in our lives is that of stewardship.

'What do you have that you have not received?' asked St Paul (1Corinthians 4:7) — and really we have a great deal, even those of us who might be considered poor in this country. Looking at those programmes like Time Team, digging up the homes of our ancestors, one is startled to see just how little people had. Some were considered to be living in the lap of luxury if they had a second cooking pot.

A priest of this diocese, now deceased, Fr Ed O'Shea impressed me with the simplicity of his life: he had lived for many years in Latin America, and when back in this country he had scarcely more possessions than one might put into a suitcase. Even books, once he had read them, he would pass on to others.

The statistic of good food thrown away in this country is alarming—'best by' dates being treated as 'poisonous after' dates.

The vineyard tenants in the Gospels were given charge of the vineyard not for their own convenience, but so that the appropriate fruit might be produced and delivered to the owner. They were stewards, not absolute owners.

In a similar way, the things that we have are given for a purpose. No doubt most of the things we have do have a purpose and serve us well, but there are also many things we have in surplus, and we might consider slimming down our possessions and giving the things we have no real need for to others who will be able to make good use of them.

To that end, charity shops and even jumble sales are a good way of recycling things that are still useable but for which we have no personal need, and perhaps are cluttering up our homes. Those who cannot afford new things can benefit also, and the institution that sells them on benefits also. So how about having a turn-out one day this week?

In all this, I am speaking to myself too, for I am something of a hoarder, as my recent move has highlighted all too painfully. But the virtue of detachment is a vitally important one for the spiritual life, and so I'm going to make an effort.
