Scripture Reflection

The figure of St John the Baptist is always an intriguing one. He is sometimes accounted as the last of the prophets; indeed his appearance reminds one of Elijah—and our Lord said that he was indeed the personification of Elijah, who had been prophesied as reappearing to foretell the coming of the Messiah.


The main message of John the Baptist is that of repentance. If we are to receive the Lord, it must be with the intention of being pure, even if we are aware that we are unlikely to manage it consistently. Human life is always led in the anticipation of the Lord; either the Jews waiting the coming of the Messiah, or us waiting his return. We have, however, the additional comfort of the pledge and anticipation of his eternal presence in Holy Communion. Yet always there is the requirement of repentance in order to receive him. It cannot be got away from.

Christian theology stresses this necessity of repentance also. This is not being negative, any more than any realistic recognition of any situation is negative. If one wants to improve one's knowledge of a language, it is important first to assess just how little one already knows, in order to fill in the gaps. If one wishes to lose weight, one must begin by getting on the scales. One then resolutely makes the effort to turn one's back on the old life and make a serious effort to live in a changed way. If this is true of so many human situations, it is even more true of matters of sin. However we may try to shrug off 'guilt' as being something negative, it remains true that it can also be our best friend. It is the moral equivalent of feeling unfit, or overweight, or whatever. It is the thing that urges us to make necessary changes in our lifestyles to live lives that are more 'together'.

And, of course, the sacrament of Reconciliation, or Confession is key in all this. Believe me, going to Confession regularly is much more important than flossing or checking your tyre pressure, and so I do recommend you do it as often as you can, and especially during the holy seasons of Advent and Lent. It is only when lived fully that our wonderful faith will be a real support and comfort to us throughout life.

Pilgrimage to Poland

We have an opportunity to join pilgrims from the Parish of the Nativity of the Lord on a pilgrimage to Poland from Monday the 30th of May to Friday the 3rd of June, 2016.

Fr. Chris Spain will be the Spiritual Director. Fr. Chris has a great love of Poland and has visited Krakow 4 times in recent years.

The itinerary and costs are being finalised at the moment. Current estimates of costs are ~£600 per person for Monday to Friday and there will be an option to extend your stay in Krakow to include the weekend of June 4th-5th for £36 per person per night B&B, sharing.
