A Call to Action

Around a hundred people from around the diocese, including some priests, a few from across the border in Southward, and a visitor from Llanelli in Wales, attended the first open meeting of ACTA (A Call to Action) at the Sacred Heart Caterham on 28th September. The main speaker was Fr. Tom O'Loughin, Professor of Historical Theology at Nottingham University. His themes were discipleship and the vision of Vatican II. The audience was engrossed as he explained how St. Paul had treated each of the Churches to which he wrote as individual communities with their own special positives and problems. The largest house church in Corinth would probably accommodate no more than 50 people. New disciples were attracted by existing ones living out their discipleship. As the community grew a new house church would be started in the neighbouring street, and so on. Pages of the letters would be passed from one to another. Fr Tom then moved to the Middle Ages, where again village churches often would serve 50-150 people at most. As in the early church, Presiders at the Eucharist would emerge from the communities, their ministry confirmed by ordination. It was an organic system in contrast to the modern model where a bishop has centres of populations round the diocese and provides priests from the pool available. He then described how, prior to Vatican II, Mass was 'heard' by the people with minimum requirement of being present for the gospel and staying until the priest's communion, with few receiving communion. Vatican II brought back, among others, the idea of priest and people coming together to worship God and celebrating Mass together and Communion was not just for the holy few. However, although the Council changed structures, it was top down. What was needed and what Pope Francis is now showing us is the need for a change in attitude for the vision to flourish. Community discipleship works continually, and that is how we need to operate in future through small groups.

Community Leaders: I am beginning the process of discernment towards the election by yourselves of community Leaders and deputies from amongst the 9 am, 10.30 am & 5.15 pm Masses respectively so that, should it happen that I was unable to celebrate the Masses on Sundays for one reason or another or perhaps during my absence and the supply priest failed to turn up, that these elected Leaders would lead a Liturgy of the Word with Communion and which would also <u>fulfil the Sunday obligation</u>. Bishop Kieran has sanctioned this. Once upon a time there were ample priests to call upon to supply but this is no longer the case and it is getting increasingly more difficult to find them. Some of the supply priests I have used recently are well into their 80's. I have invited core representatives from among the Leaven Groups who will meet shortly to advise me the best way to process this so that guided by prayer and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, Community Leaders, whether they be male or female will be chosen by yourselves through a ballot. In the meantime, if you feel that you would like to be considered for such a responsible position, please let me have your name by the 18th October. If proposing someone else, make sure you seek their permission first.


