Psalter Week 4

NEXT WEEK'S READINGS 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Exodus 17:8-13 2 Timothy 3:14—4:2 Luke 18:1-8

#### **Gospel Reflection:**

It is one of the well-known facts about the Gospel that Jews and Samaritans did not get on. The reason is that the Jews considered the Samaritans heteredox—heretical, one might say—and their blood not a little mixed with Gentile blood. But their main offence was that they would not recognize the authority of the Jerusalem hierarchy and the worship at the temple there, but got on with things at their own holy site on Mount Gerizim. Galilee, on the other hand, though even further off than Samaria, and where the people were even more of mixed blood (known as 'Galiee of the Nations', or 'of the Gentiles') was considered preferable because however mixed up was the blood of the Galileans, they were more orthodox in their Jewish beliefs—as we see from the example of our Lord's Apostles, all Galileans. And their location meant that whenever they wanted to go to Jerusalem to worship, they had to pass through Samaria.

Several times in the Gospels, we see our Lord shaming the 'authentic' Jews who prided themselves on their zeal and fidelity by comparing them to Non-Jews, such as full Gentiles—the centurion whose servant was healed, for instance—and Samaritans, such as the famous 'Good Samaritan'. The point was not that our Lord was suggesting that the Samaritan or the gentile religions were as good as the authentic Jewish religion; indeed he states quite clearly the reverse in his dialogue with the woman at the well in St John's Gospel, but rather that when we see genuine goodness practised by those who must do so without the encouragement and consolation of the true faith, then those who are true, orthodox, believers ought to take note and pull their socks up!

Today's Gospel is about gratitude and about faith. The element of gratitude is obvious, but we must not miss those last words: 'your faith has saved you'. Our Lord once more drives home the message that the physical healing is not the real matter in hand here, but the question of salvation. The other nine lepers who were healed were simply healed of leprosy. Splendid, no doubt, but they failed to draw the correct consequence of the healing which was to elicit faith in them, the faith that would save their souls and bring them to heaven. They missed the point.

Let us all daily remember to give thanks to God for all the good things which he has given us, but in response to his goodness not fail to practise and renew our faith as fervently as we can.



At the parish meeting earlier in the year it was proposed that we develop a link with St Leo the Great parish in Kimilili, Kenya. This suggestion has been received enthusiastically by the 2 priests in the Kenyan parish:

Tea & Coffee after 10:45am Mass

'Our parish has 104 small Christian communities and 8 out stations; this enables us to facilitate proper Evangelisation to our people. The population of our parish is about 6000 Christians. Our small Christian communities are made of about 20 homes/families.

Christians meet in their homes to share the word of God, pray together and occasionally celebrate the Eucharist together.

Our out stations are made of the small Christian communities of that area. Mass is celebrated in these stations on Sundays. Priests cannot manage to celebrate Mass every Sunday in these out stations therefore there is a rotational mass program every Sunday.

On special occasions (Good Friday, confirmations, ordinations, professions of the Religious) all the Christians of the parish come together in the parish centre.'
