Gospel Reflection

Sun 16th:

The words from today's Gospel have long comforted Christians in distress through the ages. And they bring home to us very strongly that Christianity is a religion of strong, apparently contradictory assertions. While elsewhere (Matthew 16:24 for instance) we are urged to carry our cross if we want to be a follower of the Lord, here we are told that his yoke is easy and his burden light. And yet both these things are true, as anyone who has truly offered his sufferings to God can tell you. G.K. Chesterton devotes a large part of his work Orthodoxy (written well before he became a Catholic) to exploring these paradoxical apparent contradictions in our faith, which extols both fertility and virginity, strength and meekness, canonizing martyrdom but deploring suicide, affirming the value of life while seeing death as the gateway to a better life yet. All these paradoxes, says Chesterton, are precisely what gives orthodox Christianity its strength, like the flying buttresses on a gothic cathedral. This sort of thing is what children see far more easily than adults; children can easily understand that their father can be both gentle and strong, and that the world is full of possibilities which the logic of the mind has not yet tried to categorize and cut down to size. They do not stop to think that a big fat man like Father Christmas could never squeeze down a chimney. Perhaps we might, then, consider that today's Gospel is an invitation to trust in our Lord's providence, Who knows far more and sees far further than we can ever hope to know or see in this present life.
