HEALTH & SAFETY**Parking**

There have been several examples of inconsiderate parking this last week. Previously Parishioners have been reminded of the importance of parking in marked bays and not parking on the double yellow lines, blocking the entrance and exit or blocking the Centenary Hall car park. This is vital to ensure that emergency vehicles can access the Church, Halls and Presbytery if they are needed. Blocking these areas potentially risks lives.

During the week Parishioners are parking around the drive whilst visiting local shops, the dentist or whilst at work. Whilst we have no problems with this we politely request that you park within the bays bearing in mind the above. It may also be courteous to leave your number with the office in case your car needs to be moved.

At 10:45AM Mass last Sunday two cars parked behind the disabled space on the right of the Church which almost blocked the drive. Cars could just about pass though but an emergency vehicle would not have passed.

Please do not park anywhere that does not have a parking bay outlined.

MADABA LINK

Parishes for Peace have introduced us to Salaam, a 31yr old Iraqi refugee who we hope will keep us informed of developments in Madaba. He has a good standard of English and is the sole supporter of his parents. By now after 2 years in Jordan Salaam

hoped to have obtained a visa for Australia. One dilemma he faces is that if he was married he would stand a much better chance of a visa. However this would not include passage to Australia for his parents. So he remains single for their sake.

"When I came to Jordan I was full of hope but after 2 years of not advancing I think I'm back to the same circle of striving to support my parents. It is a very very heavy burden that man is surrounded by these ugly and harmful circumstances."
