GOSPEL REFLECTION

What some would see as our Lord's rejection of his own family must be put into another context. The Church, the community of the redeemed is itself a huge family, and in some respects a more important one than the family we were born into. You might say that the Church is the family we were re-born into, or born again into. It is interesting that our Lord's family found his new friends and new life difficult to accept: we all know people who have experienced incomprehension, even hostility, from their loved ones when they have joined the Church, but in the end that difficult choice has to be made. Like the merchant who found the pearl of great price and who sold everything in order to buy it; we are challenged by our Lord that sometimes discipleship will cost us dear. Things worth having usually do. That, I think, is why the love that should exist within the Church should be in all of us. It was said of the early Christians 'see how they love one another!' Can that honestly be said of us? And if not, why? I thank God that our parish is a happy and a welcoming one, but we need to guard that jealously, and strengthen it, for the people sitting around you at Mass will be the companions whose company you will share for eternity.
