A NOTICE FOR EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

I am most grateful to those of you who generously give your time and energy to take Holy Communion to our housebound or hospitalised brothers and sisters.

A few matters have arisen recently, which prompts me to remind everyone of a few details:

- 1) Holy Communion should never be taken to anyone within a parish without the local parish priest being aware of it and granting his permission. Practically, this means that if one of our parishioners has moved to another parish, the permission of the new parish priest must be sought before taking Communion to that person, irrespective of how long the association has been.
- 2) Within this parish Communion must not be taken to anybody without my knowledge and consent. I am generally more relaxed than some of my neighbour clergy about Ministers of Holy Communion from other parishes bringing Communion to people originating in their own parishes. But I do need to know who is sick and housebound, and especially who is receiving the sacraments. Ministers are reminded that they must record Communions in the book held in the sacristy.
- 3) When Communion is taken from Mass, the Minister must leave directly on being given the Blessed Sacrament. No reverence (genuflection or bow) is given to anyone or anything while holding the Blessed Sacrament (because there is nothing in this universe more honourable than what one is holding): the minister must simply leave and go directly to the recipient, avoiding (where possible) any unnecessary conversation or business until Communion has been given and received.

A general point for ministers distributing Holy Communion at Mass: I would be grateful if ministers, having ascended to the Altar after the Our Father, would come to stand together behind me, rather than standing at the corners of the altar. Please do remember to genuflect as I do so—I accept that for some a genuflection is going to be only a small bob due to physical infirmity, but please do the best you can. Hanging onto a piece of furniture, even the Altar, to help is perfectly acceptable and understandable.

G O S P E L R E F L E C T I O N

First Communion taking place before Confirmation is not an ancient practice. In fact, it is only a little more than a hundred years old; Pope St Pius X was, in about 1908, asked to grant permission for children to receive our Lord as soon as they reached the age of reason, and he agreed that those who love the Lord should not be kept from him longer than is necessary. So our modern practice was born.

This means that just about every cradle Catholic alive now made his or her first Communion at (usually) 7 or 8 years old. For almost all of us it was the first really important event in our lives—birthdays and Christmasses merge into one another in our memories, but First Communion tends to have strong resonances for us into old age.

Partly it is to do with the long preparation, but also the strangeness of the event. Let us not discount also the fact that children find faith much easier than adults do—our Lord actually recommended that we have a faith like a child—and understand the solemn significance of what is going on much better than perhaps we do ourselves. They too have not sinned seriously, and can benefit from the consequent closeness to God that comes from being in a state of grace.

I suppose that for most of us, these things are in the past. But the point is that we can pray for the graces of our own First Communion day to be renewed in us. The feast of Corpus Christi is an occasion for us to revisit once more the faith we held as a child. Not childish, as such, of course, but child-like; this is to say simple, straightforward, loving, pure. Our adult sophistication serves us well perhaps in the workplace, but not so well when it comes to the things of God.

If the Lord of all can put himself into our hands, let us put ourselves into his today.

O Sacrament most holy,
O Sacrament divine!
All praise and all thanksgiving
be every moment thine!
