THE WORLD DAY FOR THE POOR

Pope Francis has asked that the Catholic Church set aside one day a year when we 'reflect on how poverty is at the heart of the Gospel'. This is The World Day for the Poor.
5 ways to observe World Day for the Poor

1) PRAY FOR THE POOR. eg use the headlines. As you see headlines about what is happening around the World, pause and pray for the people involved.

2) LEARN ABOUT POVERTY AND WORK FOR CHANGE. eg climate change, war, lack of jobs. Speak on behalf of those in need by sending letters to your MP. Tell others what you have learnt.

3) SUPPORT THE CHURCH WORK FOR THE POOR. eg CAFOD, The Children's Society, Parish- es for Peace

4) MAKE CARING FOR THE POOR PART OF THE WAY YOU LIVE. eg buy fairly traded tea, coffee, bananas etc. Consider buying world gifts from CAFOD or SVP as Christmas gifts.

5) PRACTICE THE CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY. These are Jesus' teachings - feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, and imprisoned, give alms to the poor and care for God's creation.
