MADABA ANNUAL COLLECTION FEB 3RD 2019

Sean has kindly agreed to a third annual collection after Masses on Sunday Feb 3rd for Iraqi refugees and poor parishioners in the parish of The Beheading of St John the Baptist, Madaba, Jordan. In addition to supporting over

500 displaced Iraqi Christians Fr Firas, the Madaba parish priest is struggling to assist some of his own Jordanian parishioners who are living in poverty. Our donation at Christmas provided food parcels for the refugees and two chickens for

each poor Jordanian family. Fr Firas reports that 30 families need support each week. Please be as generous as you can on Feb 3rd. Our fellow Christians in The Sacred Heart's link parish in Jordan are in great need.
