MADABA VISIT

Our few days in Madaba were very productive and provided a valuable update on the situation of the refugees. Although some families are obtaining visas and moving on, others arrive to take their place. Their stories are often harrowing and the frustration of facing an uncertain future leads to mental health

problems. Some have already lived in Jordan as refugees for 5 years. Others have had applications for visas to Western countries turned down several times. Most families now have at least one person working illegally although poorly paid. These earnings pay their rent and provide

additional food. There is no regular help for medical issues and other needs. We shared a meal with Samir Kikhwa, whose prostate cancer operation was funded by Sacred Heart parishioners and Tandridge Catenian Circle. As we stood to leave he prayed over us. His son, Salaam,

translated:

"May the Good God and His Holy Mother Mary shower blessings on all your fellow parishioners in Caterham." 24hrs after our return Salaam wrote to say he had received a call from the Australian embassy. The family now have permission to travel to Sydney in a few days time.


