IRAQI CHILDREN IN MADABA

Over 100 Iraqi children live with their families in Madaba. About 40 are still out of school. Catholic schools are private and charge fees. These are beyond the resources of many Iraqis. The Latin Patriarchate has generously agreed to pay fees for all Iraqi children this academic year. Parents need only pay a registration fee and for books and uniform. This is about £200. We have already contributed to help some of those unable to pay this amount. If not in school children are confined to home. They need outside activities. The 5th Gospel Christian charity sponsored swimming lessons for nearly 40 7-12 yr olds. Now expert swimmers we were among the proud parents when they received awards at a gala.
