WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY

Green for Go, Go for Help! World Mental Health Day 10th October. The Diocese is marking World Mental Health Day by launching a simple poster from the Ecumenical Mental Health Project in Surrey and Sussex. You will find the poster on the noticeboard in your church, it provides contact details that maybe useful to someone in crisis, giving providers of mental health and practical support services. A crisis is not always a dramatic situation, it can be a slow but growing feeling that you are less able to cope than before. Our churches have a role to play in providing a safe, welcoming and consoling space. In time we hope to have a network of contacts in each parish to ensure that mental wellbeing is in the minds of all the organisers and leaders in our parish communities. We hope very much that these contacts will share resources, training opportunities and support with other contacts across the Churches in your town or village. In that way, as Christians, we will be doing what we can together. The Ecumenical Mental Health Project is mentioned in our Diocesan Pastoral Plan and is a collaboration between the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton, Together in Sussex an initiative of the Diocese of Chichester, the Diocese of Guildford, the South Eastern Baptist Association and Sussex Partnership NHS Foundation Trust.
