SVP 'FACE-COVERINGS'



Members of the SVP have been using lockdown to organise the production of simple face-coverings for use when shopping, travelling on public transport, or on occasions when social-distancing may be difficult. This is in line with government recommendations. (From 15th June, wearing a face-covering will be a condition of travel on public transport.) A template provided on the BBC website has been used and the face-coverings can

be washed after each use. They consist of two layers of cotton with a replaceable sheet of kitchen paper between the layers, and are held in place by elastic around the ears. We will make them available to anyone in the parish who would like one on Sunday 7th June from 10.30am – 11.30am when the catholic papers are in the outer porch area. They will also be available the following Sunday while stocks last. A small donation to the work of the SVP would be greatly appreciated. CHARITY OF THE WEEK

Charities are suffering greatly from the Covid 19 lock down. Each week we have focused on a charity that had its work and needs described so that we can continue to help in whatever way we can. Here is a reminder of what we have highlighted.

JESUITE REFUGEE SERVICE UK's vision is of a world where all who have to flee their homes are welcomed with love.

You will have seen in the news that the many asylum seekers in our country have lost their jobs and accommodation due to Covid 19. As asylum seekers they are not eligible for any kind of help or benefits. The Jesuit Refugee Service is reaching out to provide food, toiletries nappies and other essentials for these people who are waiting to be given leave to remain by the British government.

Please take the time to look at the website www.jrs.net this will give you an idea of the hardship asylum seekers are suffering. You can give a donation on line or in an envelope to the parish office or go to the JRS website and arrange for items to be sent by Amazon. If you cannot help financially knowing and sharing the problem is every bit as helpful and as always please remember to pray that they may find help and kindness.

At our Day Centre @ JRS: Those who come to see us are often struggling with homelessness or hunger. They are surviving without cash whilst dealing with stress or trauma due to their experience of destitution and the uncertainties of their situation, as well as isolation and separation from family back home. We provide travel money to access critical legal and medical appointments, emergency mini-grants for newly destitute individuals and a healthy lunch each week. Our weekly Day Centre is a safe space to rest, get referrals to key services and meet friends over a cup of tea or coffee. Each month we give out over 150 toiletry packs and in winter we distribute coats and food parcels.

The **Catholic Children's Society** is continuing to support disadvantaged families facing even greater hardship due to the Coronavirus crisis. Our supporters are offering a lifeline to young carers, parents who have lost their jobs, families fleeing domestic violence and households self-isolating with ill family members. The charity anyone who is in need regardless of their beliefs.

Recently we helped a family with three young children, including an 18 month old, to keep their home (sadly loopholes in the government legislation mean vulnerable families are still being evicted).

We can all support the work of The Catholic Children's Society by:
