SCHOOL FORMS

Please note that, there has been no guidance on school admissions for 2021 entry as yet, therefore school forms should not be brought to the Parish for signature at this time. Once we have direction on this, we will inform you through the newsletter and notices after Mass.



PUBLIC MASS

As you have no doubt heard, the Government have permitted churches to reopen for public services from this weekend. The announcement having been made with very short notice, and with stringent requirements to be observed, you will understand that for a parish such as ours, this will take a little while to set things in place. The diocese have to approve our arrangements, and we have been warned that there is a queue of applicants awaiting approval. Sadly there will not be public Mass on Sunday 5th, but we will do our utmost to restart public Masses during the week. Please note Mass on Sunday 5th July will remain online live at 9am and recorded for watching later.

We have submitted our application to celebrate public Masses on Tuesdays (10am Mass), Wednesdays (10am Latin Mass), Saturdays (10am Mass and confessions) and Sundays (9am, 10:45am & 5:15pm Masses).

Parishioners will need to queue outside the Church and will be asked to enter by stewards. Everyone entering the Church must use hand sanitising gel before being shown where to sit by stewards. Pews have been arranged so that parishioners can sit with two meters distance between them. The seating arrangement will permit two parishioners per pew, a couple will count as one person. One whole family will also be able to sit in one pew. Please be aware that once the Church cannot safely seat parishioners with the necessary social distance, the doors will be closed and no further parishioners will be allowed in. Parishioners will not be allowed to stand at the back of church or in the church porch. We apologise in advance if you have to be turned away.

For your safety and to reduce the risk of fire, we have removed all private intention candles due to the use of hand sanitising gel which is 70% alcohol.

It is important to note that the toilet facility will be closed to all.

Once public Masses can be celebrated, private prayer on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays 2pm - 4pm will cease. On Sundays the Church will be opened at 8am for private prayer, then the Church will be left open for a short time after each Mass for private prayer after 10:45am and 5:15pm. It will also be left opened for a short time after the Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday public Masses. The Church will also be opened for Adoration at 9am.

The Bishop has asked all priests to keep Masses short at this time and there will not be any hymns or singing. We will not have any readers or servers., Fr Seán will manage this all. Fr Seán will give out Holy Communion under one kind during Mass onto your open flat hand. If you wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, this will be given at the end of Mass at Parishioner's own risk.

The public Masses will all be live streamed and recorded as normal, and on days where there is not a public Mass, you will still be able to watch Mass online, apart from on Thursdays where there will not be a Mass.

Please note that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended, so if you are at all nervous about public gatherings, please remain at home, and if possible assist at Mass online.

The rosary will remain at 12pm but for the time being it will continue with the Church being locked.

Our Parish Halls will remain closed until further notice.

We ask that you all be patient with us as we try to work out the best practice for public Masses. No doubt we will have further updates and adjustments to the way things are done weekly and possibly within days.

As soon as we have been given approval by the diocese to open for Mass we will be in touch again.

If Communion cannot be received during this time, you will be invited to make the following Spiritual Communion during Mass:

My Jesus, believe that you are present in the most holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.
