TRACK & TRACE

With the new Government guidelines rules over track and trace, we have a duty to record all attendees at every Mass or other gathering.

We now have a QR code displayed in the porch for your convenience, however as a lot of people do not have smart phones or do not carry their phones to Mass, we will need to take down names on entry. Writing down names and numbers every time presents considerable difficulties, not least up to over a hundred people having to do so at the same time, sharing of pens, long queues of people in proximity, constant making contact details semi-public etc.

To avoid all this, we ask that, as soon as possible, each household email the Parish Office on info@sacred-heart.co.uk to register their name and a contact telephone number (whether they plan to attend Mass this week or not). In return each household will be given a unique number which will be its identification for all future attendance of any member of that household at Church. The number can then be given to the steward on arrival, who will record the number only.

This should take less time even than accessing the QR code on the app; it avoids any sharing of pens, and maintains privacy of all contact details.

PRIMARY SCHOOLS FORM SIGNING

2021-22 Catholic applications – for Reception places for St Francis' Catholic Primary School

Extraordinarily for this year, due to the COVID situation and to best protect Fr Seán and Fr Stephen, they will not be meeting parents in person to sign the SIF forms.

The general process for applications remains the same. Before the closing date for applications:

- Parent/Carers complete their Local Authority Common Application Form online.
- Parent/Carers must also complete the SIF and return it to the school minus the section usually completed by the priest.
- The school will formally log receipt of each SIF form from each Catholic applicant.
- The school will then take all the Catholic applicants' SIFs to the priest in one go for the priests to complete the relevant section for each applicant and return to the school.

ST. JOHN'S SEMINARY, WONERSH

Many of you will have heard that St John's Seminary in Wonersh is to close in its present form. The Seminary has served the Church for 130 years and there is great sadness that formation must now end at the site.

Unfortunately there was no new intake this September. With the seminarian body numbering just 17 the community is small, with the building and staffing costs too high to sustain. Arrangements have been made for the remaining seminarians to join the community at Allen Hall, Chelsea in September 2021.

Archbishop John Wilson and Bishop Richard are committed to providing priestly formation that will serve the people of our Dioceses and parishes into the future. St John's will remain a legal entity so that consideration can be given to the ways in which the tradition of priestly formation established at Wonersh in 1891 will continue.

The Trustees of St John's are extremely grateful to rectors, staff and seminarians, past and present, and to all those who have supported the Seminary over the years. We ask our Diocesan church family to pray for vocations to the priesthood, keeping our seminarians in their thoughts and prayers over the coming months.
