MADABA

Fr Firas sends greetings to all in the Sacred Heart parish. He is very appreciative of our prayers and financial support.

Unfortunately Jordan is suffering badly from Coronavirus. On Tuesday last week over 5000 new cases were recorded. Jordan has a population of about 12 million people, 1/5 of our population. There are cases in Madaba among the Jordanian parishioners and the Iraqi refugees.

People are so afraid that Mass attendance is very low. Fr Firas suggests that most parishioners will not move far from their homes.

The government expects to vaccinate 200,000 people this month. They are struggling to source vaccines for the whole population but have taken the commendable decision to give equal priority to refugees and their own citizens.

ANGRY AT INJUSTICE - JOHN 2:13-25

This Gospel passage can be one of the more confusing. In our minds we have an image of Jesus as someone who is always calm, always peaceful; so how can it be that we suddenly see an image of Jesus who is angry and overturning stalls in the Temple?

Anger is a powerful emotion. However, unlike hate (of which nothing good can come) much good can come from appropriate anger. Jesus is angry at injustice, That the poor are being manipulated and those who are exploiting them are making a profit from doing so.

We too are called to be angry when we see injustice in our world; surely as Christians there is something wrong if we do not. But this anger must have purpose: an anger that produces actions in us that lead to us getting involved (peacefully) to bring about change to address this injustice.

Who are the exploited? E.g

- Trafficked men, women and children who have no wage, no freedom, no friendship and suffer constant fear
- **Prisoners** locked in their cells for 22 hours per day no privacy, no exercise, no shower, no dignity
- Those on benefits and very low wages always afraid of hunger and eviction.

Lord teach us to walk in another's shoes.

Lord make my heart burn with love for those I see being exploited and give me the courage to speak out against injustice in our world. Amen (taken from Lent Extra 2021)
