MADABA NEWS

With just 2 weeks before Easter is celebrated in Jordan all religious practices in churches remain suspended. Nightly curfews and other restrictions seem to be reducing the number of new cases recorded but the figures remain higher than in the UK.

We have sent £4500 to Fr. Firas to provide Easter food boxes for Iraqi refugees and poor Jordanian parishioners. He is also making preparations for his planned food bank. He has identified a suitable base and is now looking to paint and equip the room. He is keen to involve parishioners who may have surplus food to share it with poorer people in the community. Given the middle

Eastern climate and food culture he needs two freezers and a fridge in addition to shelves for dry goods.

As ever he is keen to pass on his thanks to Sacred Heart parishioners for their generous financial support.
