## SVP Request on behalf of Gatwick Detainees Welfare Group

Specific items of clothing are urgently needed, as winter approaches. You have been very generous in the past and we hope you will be able to help again this time. The SVP will be collecting items before each of the **three Sunday masses on 10th NOVEMBER ONLY.** There will be a collection box at the bottom of the ramp. Please only donate the items listed below as storage at the centre is limited. As always, thank you so much for your support.

Warm clothes: Jackets, jumpers, joggers, trainers (All sizes – Men only) Boxers and shorts are also required, but these need to be new. (All sizes – Men only)

In addition to the above, we have received a request for second-hand **mobile phones for detainees**. These can be a lifeline! Could you pass on a phone that you no longer use? Ideally, phones need to be no older than 6-7 years, in good working order, and if possible with a working charger. (no broken screens, speakers or microphones) Personal data should be wiped, and any SIM and Memory cards removed to restore it to factory default via the settings menu. Should you need any help with this, our Parish SVP members will be available after all Masses on Sunday 10th November in the Canon Roe Hall. They will be happy to collect any devices that you wish to donate.

It costs just £19.15 to feed a child with Mary's Meals for a whole school year. The meal is a maize and soya porridge, fortified with vitamins and minerals The Sacred Heart parish will be linked with Mwandakwisano School in Zambia. The school has 376 pupils.
