As autumn is now upon us a gentle reminder to take care when walking around the Church grounds as leaves are slippery when wet.

Candle safety

Can we please ask parents not to sit at the back of the church near the candles with their children. A few children have attempted to play with lit candles and it was only due to welcomers noticing that accidents were avoided. Children should be supervised at all times around the candles. We do not want to be in a situation where we have to stop using candles in Church.

Parking

We need to raise the issue of parking again. Despite renewing the painting on the drive and in the car park people are still parking on double yellow lines, by doing so you are putting the lives of all parishioners at risk. A fire engine or ambulance will not be able to access the grounds if there are cars parked on the double yellow lines at the entrance and exit to the drive. Please do not park next to the disabled space, in

the middle of the drive to the presbytery this blocks the alternative access for emergency vehicles. Please stop and think.
