On Sunday 6th July, Rev Dr Angus Ritchie, the founding director of the ecumenical Centre for Theology and Community will be giving a conference afternoon at the Fitzherbert Community Hub, Brighton BN2 1AP, 12:45-4:15pm.

Fr Angus Ritchie has ministered in parishes involved in community organising in East London for over 25 years, playing a leading role in campaigns for a Living Wage and affordable housing. He is the founding director of the ecumenical Centre for Theology and Community which helps congregations ground their community organising in prayer and theological reflection — and to harness its potential for congregational renewal, the formation of missionary disciples, and action for social justice. Catholic Social Teaching is a rich resource offering a framework for building a just and compassionate society. Our goal is to empower our communities with an inspiring, practical vision of Christian life and action in the world.
